A) General information and professional life

Ljubo Gerič (born November 19th, 1960) is technologist, teacher and politician. In 1985 he graduated at the University of Maribor, Faculty of Chemical Technology. He received the national Kidrič Student Award for his diploma work. In 1985 he got employed at the Ruše Nitrogen Factory as a technologist, and from 1987 to 1994 he was employed at the University of Maribor, Faculty of Chemical Technology. From 1992 to 1994 he completed his professional training at the University of Twente in the Netherlands. In the years 1994 to 2000 he was employed as a teacher at the Gymnasium and Secondary School of Chemistry in Ruše. From 1998 to 2000 he was the principal.

He was a member of the Municipal Council of the Municipality of Ruše from 1998 to 2012.

He was first elected to the National Assembly of the Republic of Slovenia in 2000, then in 2004 and 2008.

From May 2003 he was for one year an observer in the European Parliament and then from May 2004 until the elections for the European Parliament that year also a Member of the European Parliament.

In all mandates in the National Assembly of the Republic of Slovenia, a member of the Committee that discussed the field of sports. As part of the international activities of the National Assembly of the Republic of Slovenia, he was an alternate member of the delegation of the National Assembly to the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe.

In 2011 he was elected and served that year as the President of the National Assembly of the Republic of Slovenia.

Since 2012, he has been an advisor to the director at Energetika Maribor.

B) Work in shooting sport

Ljubo Germič has been a member of the Shooting club "I.st Pohorje Battalion Ruše" since 1970 and has been a successful competitor for many years. Already in 1983 he took over the duties of the president of the club and he still performs this function very successfully and devotedly today. As the president of the club, together with his members, he formed a new vision of the club that resulted in: wider international cooperation, organization of the International 10 m competition in Ruše – already traditionally for 27 years, club member Natalija Prednik took part at Sydney 2000 Olympic games, members of the club are members of the national team, many top results at world, European and national championships, construction of a new 10 m shooting range, training of coaching and refereeing staff, etc.

Tendered for Shooting Union of Slovenia was selected to hold the ISSF Grand Prix in Ruše for the period 2021 - 2024, where he took over the position of President of the Organizing Committee of the competition.

In the years 2001 to 2009 he was a member of the Shooting Union of Slovenia presidency, and in the 2013-2017 term, he was a vice-president of the Shooting Union of Slovenia. During these periods he was several times a delegate of the Slovenian Shooting Union at the assemblies of the European Shooting Confederation, as well as the International Shooting Sport Federation.

He is a member of General Assembly of the Olympic Committee of Slovenia.

As part of the implementation of the European 10 m Championship in Maribor in 2017, he was the president of the organizing committee of the championship. According to the participants and the professional public, the organization and implementation of the championship was assessed as remarkable. At the meeting of the Presidency of the European Shooting Confederation in Maribor, he was appointed to the Commission for Promotion, Marketing and Cooperation with Sponsors. Together with other members of the commission, he prepared substantive material for discussion within the program of the special event of the General Assembly in July 2017, in Baku.

In 2019, he became a member of the ISSF Sports Commission, which was entrusted with the task of preparing the starting points for the modernization and greater popularization of shooting sports.

He has received a number of awards for his work in shooting sport, including the most resounding: The Slovenian Shooting Union gold plaque, the Slovenian Olympic Committee - Slovenian Sport Union volunteer torch, and numerous awards from the Ruše Sports Club.
