



ESC Air Cup Super-Final Rifle and Pistol

GENERAL INFORMATION	
1. Disciplines:	Pistol & Rifle
2. Type of Event:	Individual
3. Name of Event:	Rifle M/W, Pistol M/W
4. Number of participants in each team:	First 8 ranked athletes in each discipline
5. Technical requirements:	Each athlete must fire on EST. One RO at least must be present. The final will be in Live stream.
6. Number of stages:	3 stages: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Quarterfinal stage • Semi Final stage • Medal Matches
7. Commands	All stages are fired on command. All commands are ISSF final commands. In series 30s before the end it will be announced 30s. In single shots no announcement will be made
8. Scoring	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Decimal scoring
9. Quarterfinals:	The top 8 athletes will compete as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1st ranked against 8th ranked (Pair 1) • 2nd against 7th (Pair 2) • 3rd against 6th (Pair 3) • 4th against 5th (Pair 4)
10. Number of shots in Quarterfinals:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Preparation and Sighting Time: 5 minutes • 15 shots. 3 series of 5 shots in 200 s • The winner of each series receives 1 point. Athletes with more points in pair will win and will participate in the Semi-final.
11. Tie in Quarterfinals:	Tie in series (5 shots) will be decided by additional shoot off. (1 golden shot for each athlete until the tie is broken).
12. Ranking after Quarterfinals:	The (4) four eliminated athletes from the Quarterfinals will be ranked in 5 th to 8 th places according to the results of the ranking before the final.
13. Semi Final stage:	The 4 winners from the Quarterfinals will compete as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Winner of Pair 1 against winner of Pair 4 • Winner of Pair 2 against winner of Pair 3

14. Number of shots in Semi Finals:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Preparation Time: 1 minute • 15 shots. 3 series of 5 shots in 200 s <p>• The winner of each series receives 1 point. Athlete with more points will participate in the Gold Medal match.</p> <p>Two remaining athletes of the Semi Finals will qualify for the Bronze Medal match.</p>
15. Tie in Semi Final stage:	Tie in series (5 shots) will be decided by additional shoot off. (1 golden shot for each athlete until the tie is broken).
16. Medal Matches:	The Bronze Medal Match will be shot first, followed by the Gold Medal Match.
17. Scoring in Medal Matches:	<p>Single shots Athlete with the highest shot receives 1 point. 4 points win a set. Two sets win the match. In case of an equal results, no points are given.</p>
18. Bronze Medal Match:	<p>Two remaining athletes from the Semi Finals will take part in the Bronze Medal Match</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1 min. Preparation time • Presentation of Athletes • 40sec. for each shot • Up to 4 points one by one for a set, • After 2 sets are won, the winner will be declared as Bronze Medallist.
19. Gold/Silver Medal Match:	<p>Two top ranked athletes from the Semi Finals will take part in the Gold Medal Match</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sighting is authorised during Bronze medal match • 1 min. Preparation time. (No sighting shots is allowed in this time.) • Presentation of Athletes • 40sec. for each shot • Up to 4 points one by one for a set, • After 2 sets are won, the winner will be declared as Gold Medallist.
20. Tie in Medal Matches:	In case of an equal shot, no points are given.
21. Malfunction:	The ISSF rule will be followed.
22. Penalties:	Will be decided according to ISSF rules.
23. Video link requirements:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 800kbps/1.0 Mbps (up/down)
24. Irregular cases:	Any irregular or disputed cases will be decided according to the ISSF rules.
